

Your rights

You may speak freely on any subject without being sent to jail for saying something not popular. However, you may not use obscenity or curse words, make untrue statements intending to harm others, or encourage listeners to harm others or disobey laws.



You may worship any way you want or hold any religion you want. You may also choose not to practice a religion.



Your responsibilities

You must obey all laws.



When you are 18, you should vote for the best people, such as representatives and senators, to make laws. You should vote for the best people, such as a governor and president, to enforce laws.



You may publish anything you want, but should be careful to write only truthful statements.



Adult citizens could choose to run to become a representative or senator.



You may meet with others to criticize the government.



You should pay attention to how well your representatives, senators, governor, and president do their jobs. Elect someone different if they do not do a good job.



The police can't put you in jail for no reason.



You must pay taxes to help the government do its work when you have a job and earn money.



The police cannot search your home without a good reason.



You should notice problems in the community and think of solutions.



The government cannot take your property without a good reason.



In school, you have the right to be safe.



In school, you have the responsibility to follow safety rules to keep everyone safe.
